 - a. MH referrals go directly to Kaylyn try to connect to resources and determine eligibility for case management.
- 6. Buffalo Police Department Sgt. Mark Brown
 - a. Therapy Dog Luna.
 - Luna is in the process of therapy training and currently lives at the PD.
 - When ready, Luna may go out on calls all depending on the situation.

 - a. Behavioral Health

- Behavioral Health Crisis Center under development. From 2018 Bonding to build BHCC build or remodel CentraCare convened a group to discuss the potential. Regional HS directors all part of initial conversations. Stearns County ultimately ended up being the applicant.
- Will be built on CMMHC main campus.
- Stearns County entered in a grounds lease to CMMHC and lease building to CMMHC to operate out of cost neutral.
- This building will house residential crisis program
 - (a) Expand from 5 to 9 all single rooms
 - (b) Detox has 16 beds remain 16 beds in new building but will be double rooms. In process of applying detox to become withdrawal mgmt. (Licensed 245F maintain dual license withdrawal and subacute intoxication)
 - (c) Now get access to new programs
 - ♦ Residential crisis voluntary basis 2-3 days.
- Goal is to be open and delivery services by end of 2021.

 - Mental Health visits are available by appointment
 - Medical Health visits are available 24/7

- Partnering with MDH and Metro Transit to have a mobile vaccination bus for COVID-19 vaccines.
- d. WCCA Eric Nagel
 - Approved waiver service provider now for Health Partners and UCare
 - Have contacted over 900 older adults in the county
 - (a) 107 do not want to receive the vaccine
 - ♦ Afraid about the process, do not trust that it is safe yet
 - ♦ Fear of leaving home to get the vaccine
 - (b) 400 + of those they have contacted with have been vaccinated at this time
 - Been providing frozen meals during the pandemic to those unable to get out to grocery store
 - BREAD Books, Reading, Encouragement and Discovery
 - (a) Donations for the program are welcome just need to fit in a duffle bag
