

WRIGHT COUNTY CHILD FOSTER CARE LICENSING PROCESS

- The average time for completion of the licensing process is 90-120 days.
- As part of the licensing process, you will learn about the Wright County foster care program, licensing requirements, and how children are placed into foster care.
- This process also involves gathering information about you, your family, and your home. Through the licensing process, we are able to identify the strengths you bring to the foster care program and ensures standard licensing requirements are met.
- Orientation to the foster care program involves the participation of the applicant, co-applicant, and if age appropriate, your children.

Initial Steps to Become Licensed

1. Attend orientation parts I and II
2. Submit Application for Licensure
3. Wright County Human Services will send you licensing paperwork
4. Submit fingerprint card & releases to complete background studies
5. Complete and return remaining licensing forms
6. Complete required training
7. Licensing social worker will visit your home

When all paperwork and training is complete, the licensing worker will visit your home to learn more about your family dynamics and ensure your home meets safety requirements for child foster care.
