

- Education and counseling
- Free pregnancy testing
- Medical exam at a local clinic
- Screening for sexually transmitted infections
- Screening for breast, cervical, and testicular cancer
- Condoms and spermicides
- Full range of birth control methods
- Information on abstinence and fertility awareness
- Referrals for social and medical issues
- Abortion services not provided

What is Family Planning?

- It is voluntary planning and action taken by a person to prevent, delay, or achieve a pregnancy.

Why is it important?

- It helps you time pregnancy when you can best care for a child.
- It promotes healthy pregnancy.
- It helps keep you healthy by having regular check-ups and testing.
- It can help find health problems early. This can help protect your ability to have children in the future.
