

Full Explanation of WOW Van Services & Screenings

Immunizations – Suggested \$10

Immunizations against most Vaccine Preventable Disease are available through the Minnesota Vaccines for Children and Uninsured (MnVFC) and the Uninsured or Underinsured Adult Vaccines Program (UUAUV). A suggested \$10 fee is assessed per immunization for those without insurance or without vaccine coverage, however, no one is denied for inability to pay. Limited private vaccines are available to those with insurance. All vaccines are billable for children on Medical Assistance or Minnesota Care. Adult & children Influenza vaccinations are billable to most major insurance companies. Education, printed materials, and counseling are also available.

Fluoride Treatment – Suggested \$20

Fluoride Varnish is applied to teeth to protect teeth from decay. Available from the time of first tooth eruption and can be applied every 6 months. This is a billable service for children on Medical Assistance or Minnesota Care.

Car Seat Check – Suggested \$10 by appointment only

Education, demonstration on proper use and installment, and recall check are done by certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians. Additional Child Passenger Safety services offered at the Wright County Health & Human Services building in Buffalo.

Community Resources

A wide variety of health education materials, information on local services, and health care applications.

Blood Pressure ~ Free

A simple blood pressure is taken to assess the risk for hypertension. Education, printed materials, and counseling are also available.

Cholesterol Screening – 12 hour fast is required ~ \$35 fee

A full lipid profile consists of total cholesterol, LDL, HDL, Triglycerides, and TC-HDL ratio. A blood glucose and blood pressure are also included. Blood sample is obtained by a finger stick. Education, printed materials, and counseling on lowering your cholesterol follow the American Heart Associations “Life’s Simple 7” curriculum.

Blood Glucose Screening– 8 hour fast is suggested ~ Suggested \$5

A blood samples is obtained by a finger stick to determine the risk for diabetes. Education, printed materials, and counseling are also available. This service is billable for children on Medical Assistance or Minnesota Care.

Pregnancy Test ~ Free

Urine sample is taken to determine pregnancy; Medical Assistance verification forms are available upon request.

Hemoglobin Screening – Suggested \$5

First a CDC Pre-Diabetic paper screening will be completed to determine the risk for Pre-Diabetes. Then a small blood sample is obtained by a finger stick to determine the level of glucose in the blood over the last 90 days. Education, printed materials, and counseling are also available. This service is billable for children on Medical Assistance or Minnesota Care.

Hemoglobin A1C Screening – No fasting required – Fees Vary

A blood sample is obtained by a finger stick to determine the level of hemoglobin in the blood. Education, printed materials, and counseling are also available. Diabetic testing is available to those wanting to monitor their blood sugars between Primary Care visits.

Lead Test – Suggested \$20 ~Done at the WCHSS building in Buffalo

A blood sample is obtained by a finger stick to determine the level of lead in the blood. Education, printed materials, and counseling are also available. This service is billable for children on Medical Assistance or Minnesota Care.

Mantoux Test ~ \$35 fee

This is a screening tool (small amount of solution inserted via needle under the skin on the forearm) to determine any exposure to Tuberculosis and requires a follow-up reading 48-72 hours after administration.

Radon Test Kit ~ \$5

Short-term take home kit to test for Radon in the home. Please see the Wright County Public Health [Environmental Health page](#) for ways to purchase a long-term test kit.

Well Testing Kit – Free, but fee will apply at point of sample drop off

Take home kit to test for Nitrates and Coliform bacteria in independent home wells. A fee will be applied when sample is returned to Wright County Government Center – Planning & Zoning Division.
